
## The most overlooked spaces of your district's facilities

Spaces dedicated to **housing IT equipment** average less than 0.5% of a district's total interior square footage. Yet if even one of these spaces doesn't meet industry best practices, it could put your entire district's digital connectivity at risk including IP-connected security, wireless access, and instructional technology systems.



It is important to note differences in school district terminology:

- Main Distribution Frames (MDFs) and Intermediate Distribution Frames (IDFs) are telecomm legacy terms from the '70s referring to telephone-related spaces.
- Communications Equipment Rooms (CERs) and Technology Rooms (TRs) are more contemporary, inclusive terms for spaces that house IT equipment and other technology systems beyond voice and data to include security and instructional classroom systems.
- Server Rooms are especially important CERs that require greater security measures and in-room environmental controls.
