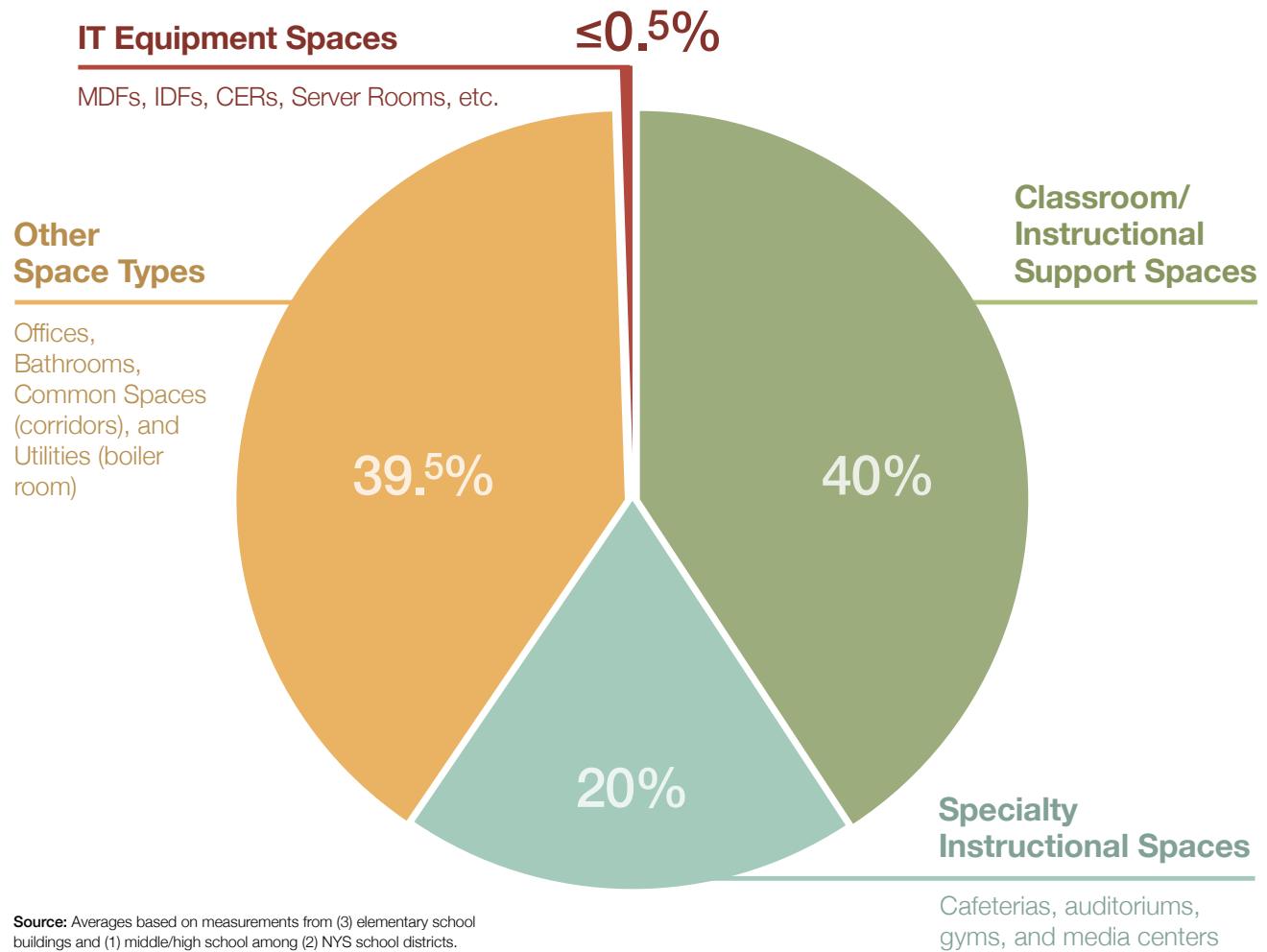


The most overlooked spaces of your district's facilities

Spaces dedicated to **housing IT equipment** average less than 0.5% of a district's total interior square footage. Yet if even one of these spaces doesn't meet industry best practices, it could put your entire district's digital connectivity at risk including IP-connected security, wireless access, and instructional technology systems.



It is important to note differences in school district terminology:

- **Main Distribution Frames (MDFs)** and **Intermediate Distribution Frames (IDFs)** are telecomm legacy terms from the '70s referring to telephone-related spaces.
- **Communications Equipment Rooms (CERs)** and **Technology Rooms (TRs)** are more contemporary, inclusive terms for spaces that house IT equipment and other technology systems beyond voice and data to include security and instructional classroom systems.
- **Server Rooms** are especially important CERs that require greater security measures and in-room environmental controls.
